• 4092 dairy farms, 1045 activities monitored, 46 discharge consents.

Northland Dairy Population 2015: 380,000 Waikato Dairy Population 2015:

1,759,000

A failure to comply in the Waikato

Northland has fewer consents than Waikato, yet monitors all Dairy Farms annually. In the Waikato this figure is well under 50%.

Northland has 1/5th the Dairy cow numbers, but issues more than 3 times as many formal actions.

In the Waikato

- 78.7% of monitored activities were not Fully Compliant
- 98% of Discharge Consents were not Fully Compliant

These metrics have barely changed in a decade.

This suggests a systematic and consistent failure in compliance management.

The status quo on monitoring and enforcement is not working, and will not deliver Healthy Rivers in any timeline

How do we fix our sick waterways?

- Fund monitoring and enforcement properly
- Harness consumer science it doesn't all have to be only Council's problem – give us the tools to measure our own water quality, make it publicly exchangeable.
- Monitor 100% all of all farms annually
- Set time-bound, measurable goals for short term action
- Enforce the law, it is the Council's statutory duty
- Clean rivers by 2040, **not** by the time our grandchildren have passed.
