The nitrogen reference point being based on 2014/15 and 2015/16 Page 47) is unfairly arbitrary. There are reasons why some years we may need to use more or less fertilizer and some years can be arbitrarily low. This is an unfair basis.

In addition this clause is effectively a grand-parenting of people who have used very high levels of fertilizer which us unfair to those who have deliberately been moderate in our fertilizer use. This is highly inequitable.

It also seems the provision could stop any further development of our farm and farms generally. This would be a tragedy for all affected rural communities as responsible development (which is not destructive of the environment) is central to the psyche of so many farmers.

In relation to Certified Industry Schemes as I understand there are none in existence so it is impossible to make any meaningful comment. It is very disquieting to be invited to submit on an unknown and undefined assumption.

There is also ambiguity re Farm Environment Plans. I have questions as to the integrity of such plans and how they can be equitable between people and not left to inconsistent interpretation and implementation or to gaming. It is important that the requirements on people are consistent between people in relation to their farms and the environmental risks and impacts. Those having the greatest impacts should be required to make the biggest changes and remediation.

There are also added difficulties for us given that we have part of the block leased out and our lessees are buying fertilizer for a number of properties. This confuses the issue as to how much is used on the area of our farm which is leased to them.

In addition I am aware that there is widespread concern about the accuracy of OVERSEER for its reliability for properties like ours. To tie us to an unreliable measure is highly problematic.

Delete requrements to be held at or below a property's nitrogen reference level for drystock farming.

Allow flexibility in nitrogen discharges for low leaching land uses such as drystock farming.

Delete OVERSEER as a regulatory tool.

Include a list of Certified Industry Schemes

Amend Schedule 1 FEP so that its application is equitable between people and not left to inconsistent interpretation and to gaming.

Amend the plan so that it addresses issues associated with lease blocks and difficulty in determining inputs such as fertilizer to those blocks.

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
